Access to Licenced Social Rooms

Purpose

This document is intended as a set of Rules governing the Sale of Liquor and access to the Social rooms during Licensed hours and as such is a Policy Document of the Board of the Dromana Football & Netball Club (Inc).

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Rules for accessing Licenced Rooms and the Sale of Liquor

These Rules apply to all persons accessing Social Rooms during hours when Licenced for Alcohol sales and as such are binding on all persons entering rooms during Licenced hours. These rules do not replace or overrule any part of the Liquor Control Act and where a clash may take place between the two documents the Liquor Control Act takes precedence.

1. The following classes of Membership are full club members as pertaining to the Liquor licence providing they have satisfied the relevant requirements under the club constitution and as such have full access rights to the Social rooms during the hours indicated on the Liquor Licence.
 - Life Member
 - Sponsor
 - Full Member
 - Associate Member
2. All other classes of membership or visiting teams and officials must be signed in by a Full Club Member. This rule applies to guests of Full Members.
3. All non-members and guests must record their name and address in a book provided for that purpose prior to entry into rooms during Licenced hours save for visiting team members and officials when a copy of the relevant team sheet will be attached to attendance book as a record of their name and endorsed by an executive member of the Dromana Football & Netball Club (Inc).
4. Non members can only be signed in by Full member on (3) three occasions in the current football season. A Full member may only sign in three non-members on any day except if that member is an Executive Committee member. An Executive Committee member may sign in up to 50 people on any given day.
5. As per Club Constitution no person under the age of eighteen years shall be admitted as a full member or guest and apart from members of the club's Under 18 team shall be accompanied by a parent or guardian when accessing social rooms during licenced hours.
6. Persons under eighteen years of age shall not be provided with alcohol and any member found to be providing alcohol shall be brought before the club's Board of Management within (14) fourteen days of the incident.
7. Should the rooms be used by the club for functions such as Junior presentation where the majority of those attending may be unaccompanied Junior players there will be no sale of liquor even if the function is during normal licenced hours.

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8. When the rooms are hired out by the LMSG on days when the licence would normally be operating the hirer must obtain a B.Y.O. licence to consume alcohol. The use of the Club's licence is not permitted.
9. No officer or servant of the club shall receive commission or allowance from the receipts of the club for the sale and disposal of liquor.
10. The Executive committee and/or their nominee must have attended a Responsible Serving of Alcohol course and a notice indicating this must be displayed in rooms.
11. The Executive committee or their nominee shall exercise full control over the social rooms during Licenced hours in regards to access, behaviour of patrons and inappropriate language.
12. Bar staff or Executive committee or their nominee has the right to refuse service to any person effected by alcohol or whose behaviour or language is deemed to be adversely effecting the good order of the social rooms and has the right to request they leave the premises. Should such person/s refuse to obey this request the Police will be called.
13. All parents accompanied by underage children shall be responsible for their behaviour and ensure they do not disturb other members.
